Adjacent sections of metal cable trays should be connected using joint fitting plates, with screws fastened tightly. The horizontal alignment between two joined sections must not exceed a 2mm deviation. maintain spacing or to keep cables in place when the tray is ect the minimum bend ra-dius for cables as they exit the bottom of the cable tray. A rung spacing of 6 to 9 inches (150 to 230 mm) is preferable when the cable tray cont d for instrumentation and control applications that require. The spacing between trays, whether horizontal or vertical, depends on various factors like cable type, environment, and tray material.
